Cook's Corner



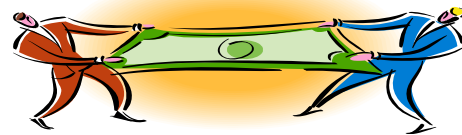
PECAN PIE MUFFINS

Ingredients:

- 1 cup packed light brown sugar
- ½ cup all-purpose flour
- 2 cups chopped pecans
- 2/3 cup butter, softened
- 2 eggs beaten

Instructions:

- Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.
- Grease muffin cups generously (or they will stick)
- In medium bowl, stir together brown sugar, flour and pecans.
- In separate bowl, beat the butter and eggs together. Stir in dry ingredients just until combined.
- Spoon batter into muffin cups about 2/3 full.
- Bake for 12-13 minutes for mini muffins or 15-17 minutes for regular size muffins.
- Run a knife around the edge of each muffin and pop them out.

DID YOU KNOW!

The new TSSA Regulations require residents with propane appliances to have their tank and appliances inspected if the tank is over 10 years old. Can you prepare for this inspection....YES!!!!

Here are some important tips (to be completed by a electrician or contractor).....

Your propane supplier will contact you for this inspection. If your tank is over 10 years, it will likely be replaced. If you pay a yearly fee, your new tank will be covered, but you will need to pay for a new regulator and its installation.

Your propane lines that run from your tank to your appliances (under your home) need to be marked properly with stickers (by a qualified contractor) and

attached to the underside of your home.

Your stove (if propane) must be at least 30 inches from the top of the stove to any cupboards that are located above your stove or the hood (exhaust fan). Your stove should not be against a wall of any type. This is a fire hazard.

The shut off valve must be 2 inches from the floor level to the stove.

Interior gas line must be electrically bonded.
