

Pinwheel Cookies

1 cup butter
 ½ lb. cream cheese
 2 cups all-purpose flour
 1/4 tsp. salt
 Raspberry jam
 Chopped walnuts
 Vanilla icing, if desired.

Method:

- * Cream butter, add cream cheese and mix in flour and salt.
- * Refrigerate over night.
- * Next day roll dough thin, spread with raspberry jam and sprinkle with walnuts.
- * Roll up jelly roll style and slice thin.
- * Bake in 350 degree oven until golden brown.
- * Cool and ice with vanilla icing if desired.
